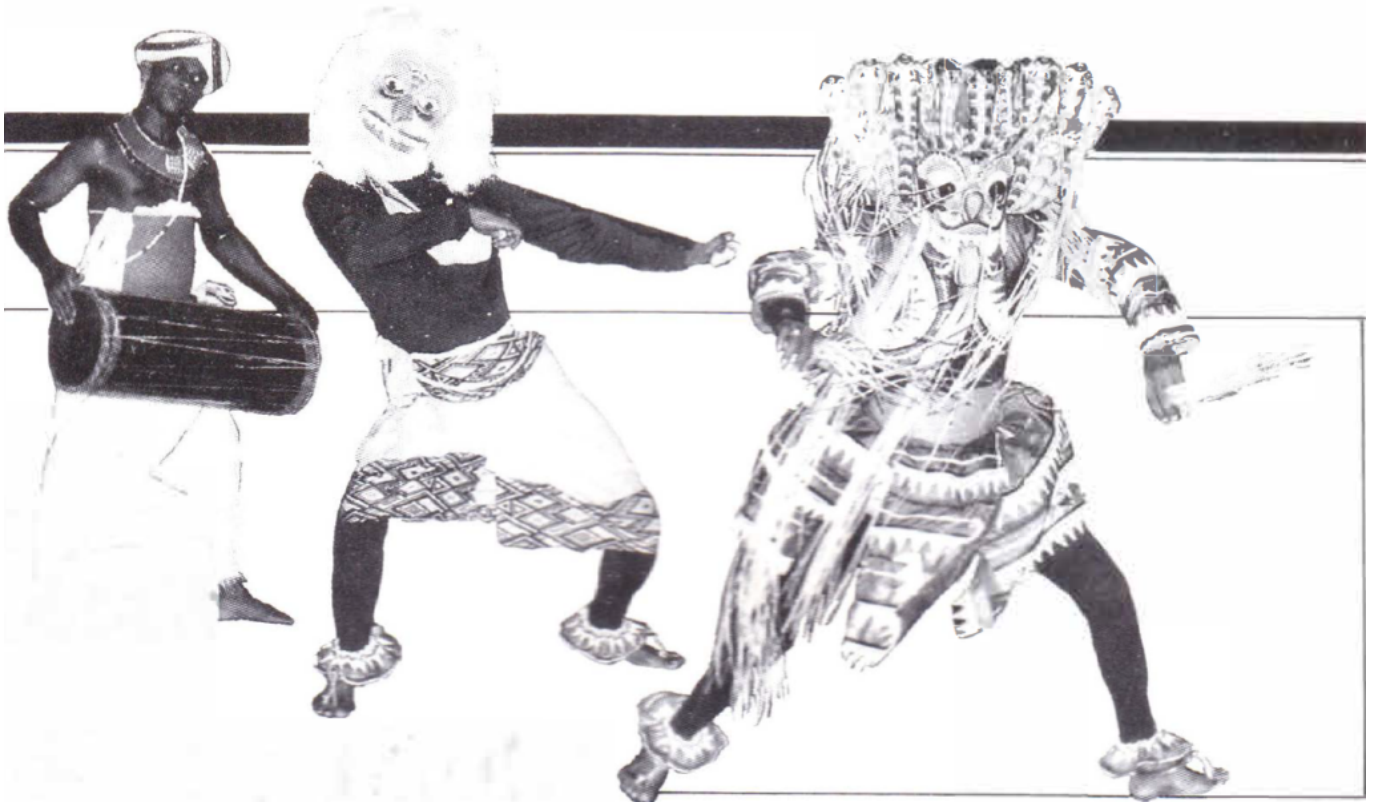


A Unique Evening Programme: Colombo by Night
