Theniya Ratnayake and Dulan Weerasinghe were each honored as Best Actors, while Thilanka Wickramasinghe and Mashika Methmini triumphed as Best Actresses. Acting merit was secured by Sandamini Dissanayake and Chamuka Induwara. Dulan Weerasinghe also received accolades for Best Choreography, Best Set Design, and second place for Best Script.
