These are CTH certified courses and run from three to six months. Tailor-made courses are offered for the requirements of individual organisations, and onsite training is offered at the clients premises.

Harpo Gooneratne, Managing Director of Harpo Productions said that, "all courses

eventually will be affiliated internationally while plans are in progress to obtain state recognition for the basic courses. The fee structure is both affordable and competitive, and varies depending on individual requirements. Sri Lanka's best available trainers will handle the training while expatriate trainers will be brought down for any specialised areas required".
