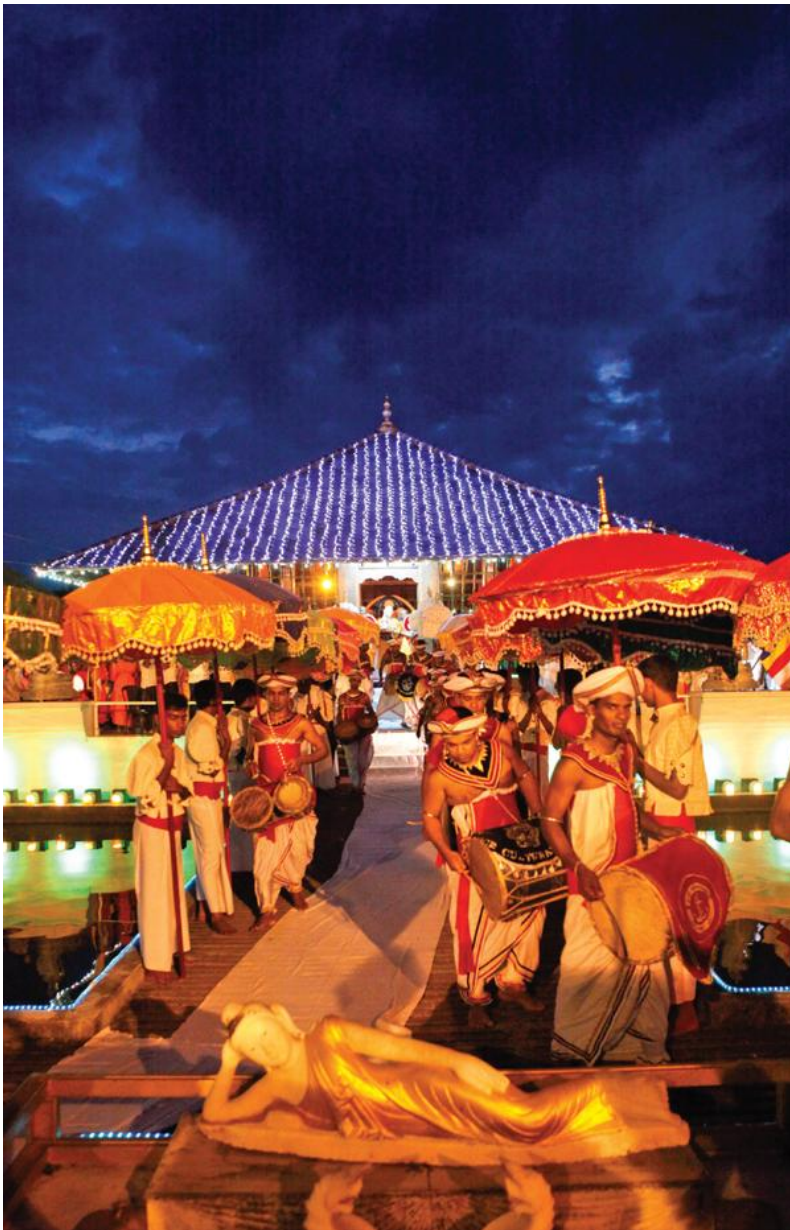


Nawam Maha Perahera: Colombo Comes Alive
