Colombo Lighthouse

Catching sight of elephants strolling along the roadside is a common sight, particularly at dawn and during the evening. Arugambay also offers a gastronomic adventure to diners, featuring Sri Lankan dishes, BBQ, or a fusion of western and eastern cuisine. For an unforgettable adventure, take the Buttala-Sella Kataragama Road, where the gentle giants roam close to the road. Or hop on a Tuk Tuk and explore Arugambay, Pottuvil, Urani, and Panama. Arugambay is a little paradise that has retained its inherent simplistic charm and beauty.

Kalkudah

The beach is ideal for surfing and wind surfing during the month of September.

Kuchchaveli

A sandy stretch with calm and peaceful surroundings, perfect for a walk along the beach.

Nilaveli

At the end of the 10km stretch of beach beginning at Uppuveli, this is the closest beach to Pigeon Island and is one of the most-popular tourist attractions.

Passekudah

Uppuveli

Surf the waves

Arugambay is a surfer’s paradise. Whisky Point, Pottuvil Point, Arugambay Point, Crocodile Rock, Elephant Rock, Okanda Point, Light House/Green Beach, Panagala Point and Panama Point are best to visit from April to October.

Arugambay point

This is one of the most popular surf breaks in Arugambay as well as one of the top surf points in the world. Easily accessible from the beach,

the rolling waves reach up to six feet making this point an ideal destination for professional surfers.

Crocodile Rock/Elephant Point

The rock gains its name with a characteristic shape resembling a crocodile. The surf point can be accessed by passing through the bushes. Climb the rock to enjoy stunning views of the sunset.

Lighthouse Point

Located along the Komari beach, the Lighthouse Point is a scenic surfing destination with beautiful waves against the backdrop of the blue sky.

Okanda Point

Reached through an off-the-beaten-track path by the Kumana National Park and Kudumbigala Sanctuary, Okanda Point is for the daring surfers.

Panama Point

Trincomalee

Oluvil Lighthouse

The Lighthouse is situated approximately 12km

south of Kalmunai in the southern east coast of Sri Lanka.

Kattankudy

Located within the Lahugala sanctuary, it is famed for the ‘Magul Maduwa’, the altar upon which the princess married King Kavantissa, thus becoming Queen Viharamaha Devi of Ruhuna. *Lahugala, Ampara*

Muhudu Maha Viharaya

The temple is found on the sand dunes of Pottuvil and the beautiful white stupa can be seen all the way from Arugam Bay beach. Muhudu Maha Vihara is said to be the ancient temple built by King Kavantissa in the second century BC. *Pottuvil*

Nuwaragala

An ancient fortress and monastery which is situated along the Mahiyangane-Dimbulagala-Dalukkane Highway in Ampara.

National Park

Flood Plains National Park

Situated along the Mahaweli River, the Flood Plains is an elephant corridor in Polonnaruwa. *Off Polonnaruwa-Batticaloa Road (Route A11), Habarana Road, Minneriya*

Gal Oya National Park

A hidden treasure in Sri Lanka’s collection of parks and protected environments. It’s a place to immerse in nature and witness the untouched beauty of the wild. *Ampara*

Kumana National Park

‘Deegawapiya’ graced by the Lord Buddha is one of the sacred ancient religious sites among the sixteen places of worship of the Buddhist devotees. *Ampara*

Galmaduwa Raja Maha Vihara

An ancient Buddhist temple believed to be constructed during the during the reign of king Saddha Tissa. *Ampara*

Girihandu Seya

Situated at Thiriyaaya, some 40km north of Trincomalee, this stupa, according to some accounts, is the first dagoba ever built in Sri Lanka. *Trincomalee*

Grand Jumma Masjid, Kattankudy

Located in Kattankudy, this mosque is an important religious site with an impressive exterior, similar to that of Al Aqsa Mosque in Jerusalem. *Katankudy.* +94 77 727 0387. *Opening hours: 4am–10pm.*

Kudumbigala

Kudumbigala monastic complex in Panama, off the coastal district of Ampara in the East of Sri Lanka was built as far back as 246 BC during the reign of King Devanampiyatissa. It is the very first sanctuary built for Buddhist monks in Sri Lanka and therefore holds immense historical value.

Lakshmi Narayana Perumal Kovil

The Kovil in blue and and gold hues is purely

dedicated to the supreme deity Vishnu and his consort Lakshmi.

Mahiyanganaya

A popular pilgrimage site for Buddhists. It is said to be the first place on the Island visited by the Buddha in 528 BC, and the Miyuguna Seya, Sri Lanka’s first stupa, was built shortly afterwards.

Also called as Ukanthamalai Murugan Kovil, devotees journey throrowship on the annual Pada Yatra that journeys from Jaffna to Kataragama via the Kumana National Park. *Okanda*

Samangala Forest Hermitage

Samangala Cave Temple Complex is believed to be built by the King Saddhatissa (137-119 BC). This cave complex consists of about 50 drip-ledged caves in the eastern slopes of the Samangala rocky hill. The ancient Buddhist monks have used these caves for meditation. *Ampara*

Seruvila Temple

An ancient temple sacred to Buddhists. *Trincomalee*
























Shri Badrakali Amman Kovil

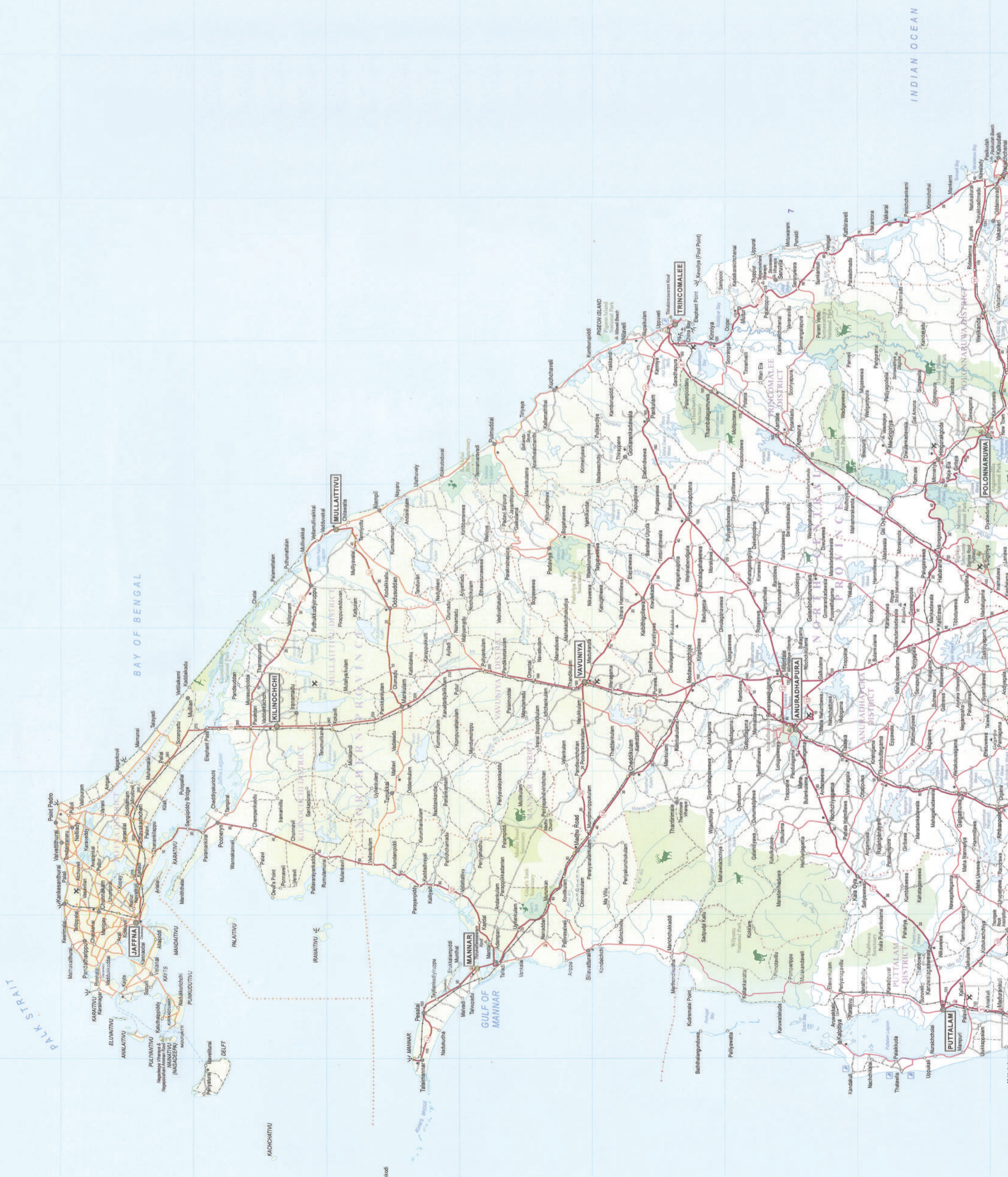

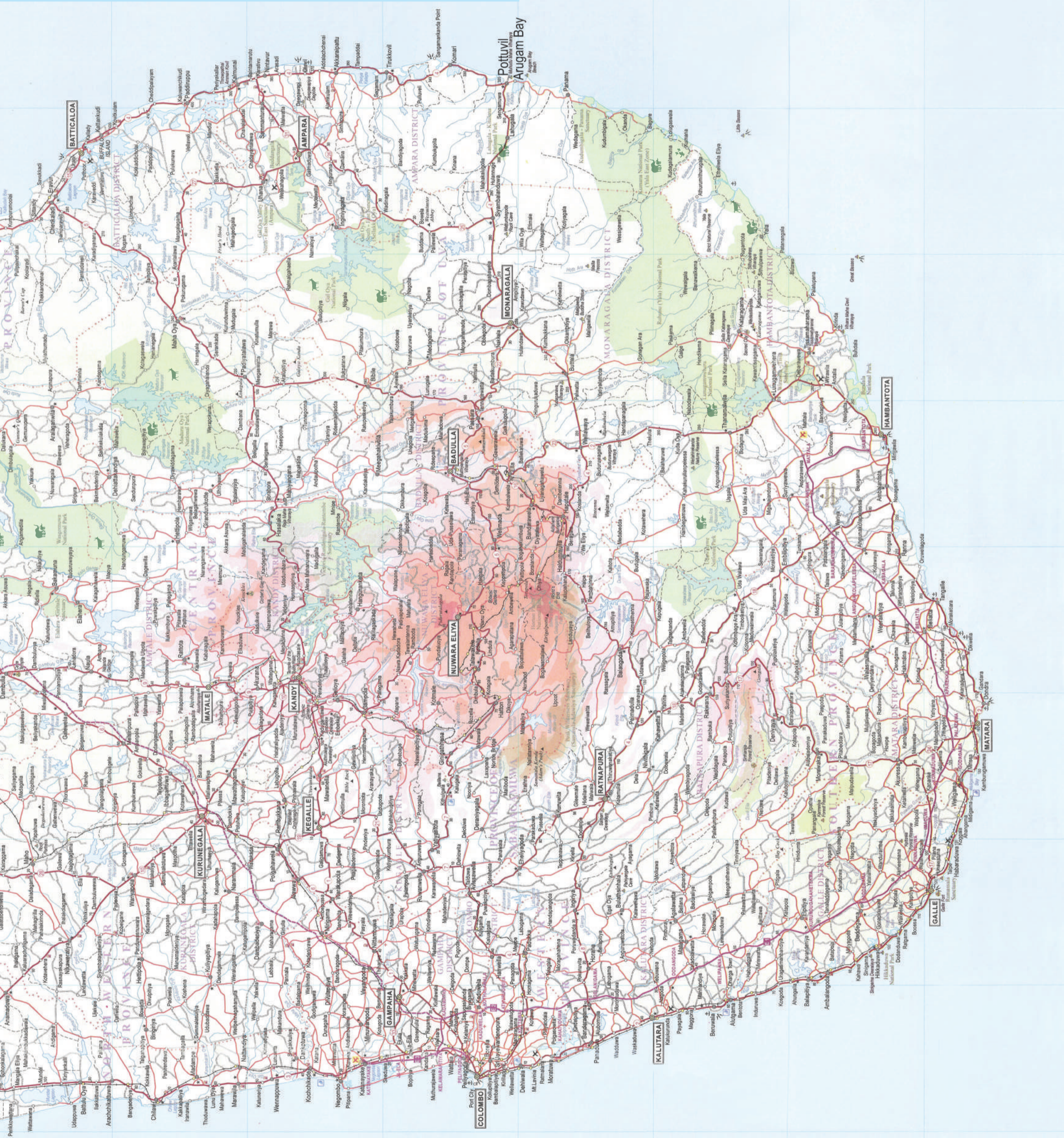

Turtle Watching

The season from February to July also signals the start of turtle nesting, and you can witness the beautiful spectacle at Kosgoda, Rekawa, Bundala and Ambalantota.

Cultural sites

Galle Fort

Overlooking the Indian Ocean, it is declared a World Heritage site, the Fort itself is a vibrant part of this city as is apparent as you walk through its inner streets, where houses have been converted into restaurants, art galleries and antique and fashionable shops. The Lighthouse stands in the Fort waiting to be explored.

Kalutara

The Kalutara Bodhi, bridge and Gangatilleke Viharaya are among other historical landmarks.

Madunagala hot water wells

The Madunagala hot spring is located in the Highland and Vijayan boundary. This hot spring is 11, 582ft deep with its water running at a speed of about 645ml per second, and is of varying temperatures.

Matara Fort

The Matara Dutch Fort, built by the Dutch in 1645 and then handed over to the British in 1796, still stands strong and proud at the centre of the town.

Star Fort

The only fort in Sri Lanka, built in the form of a star has its own historical significance and stands in the town of Matara.

Beaches

Bentota

Known for the ideal seas for water sports, visitors find themselves enjoying a thrilling speed boat ride, jet ski ride, and surfing, water skiing or kite surfing. Venture inland for an artistic treat at the Lunuganga and the Brief Garden by Geoffrey Bawa and Bevis Bawa respectively.

Beruwala

A stretch of golden sandy beach offering a tropical paradise.

Dickwella

Hummanaya Blow Hole

The name Hummanaya is attributed to the noise made when the water gushes up the narrow fissure. Watch the sea water spurt out to towering heights when it thrusts water against the narrow rocky cove and pushes it through a hole in the rock bed with a ‘wheezing’ sound.

Hikkaduwa

One of the most popular beaches and emerged as a surfing and backpacking hotspot in the 1970’s. The town continues to maintain its laidback atmosphere, as well as a vibrant nightlife, which attracts large numbers of young travellers.

Hiriketiya

A small cove on the southern coast, Hiriketiya is also known as the ‘Blue Beach’ by the international tourists who make their way to the beach, attracted by the splendid surfing opportunities.

Kalutara

With the rare combination of seascapes, river views and a beautiful skyline with the stupa, Kalutara beach is perfect for a stopover. Soft sand gives way to crashing waves and if you wait for the sunset, it will be one of the most spectacular ones you have ever seen.

Koggala

Koggala is also the home of the famous Martin Wickramasinghe Folk Museum, and watch stilt fishermen – a popular sighting.

Mirissa

Whale watching is one of the many delights that

Mirissa has in store. Famous for the sightings of the gigantic blue whale, it is also in close vicinity to several charming beaches like Dalawella and Polhena.

Tangalle

Tropical sunlight abounds in Tangalle, a coastal town 35 kilometres to the east of Matara. Reminders of 18th century Dutch days, old villas and a fort add historical presence along with a centuries’old rock temple, Mulkirigala.

Unawatuna

A popular beach that is ideal for swimming, and snorkelling. As the sun sets down, the nightlife begins to come to life, and guests can enjoy delectable meals and cold drinks or dance the night away to lively beats.

Weligama

A beach break ensures that the waves are not too strong, making the waters safe for an amateur rider to learn surfing. As the night falls, the beach village comes alive, with lights flickering in many a restaurant and bar along the coastal highway, serving good food and music.

The Bogoda wooden bridge rests proudly just as it had for over centuries making it one of the oldest wooden bridges of its kind in existence. At the end of the bridge is the Bogoda Raja Maha Viharaya.

Castlereigh reservoir
The hauntingly beautiful Castlereigh reservoir with its large collected water span is another breathtaking site.

Haputale

The must see include Adisham bungalow, Lipton’s Seat, Idalgashinna, Horton Plains, Thangamale Sanctuary and the beauty of the Bambarakanda as well as Diyaluma waterfalls.

Idalgashinna

Another ideal hiking destination. Trekking past the railway lines is the small hamlet that leads the adventure enthusiasts to explore the mountains.

Lake Gregory

Along the lake you will see groups either enjoying a family picnic, riding horses, on a paddle boat or taking a leisurely stroll.

Lipton’s Seat

The name Lipton’s Seat was derived from Sir Thomas Lipton who had enjoyed views of the picturesque mountains and emerald hills.

Maskeliya

The town is an intriguing combination of ancient and modern tea country lifestyle. Places to visit are Gartmore falls, Maskeliya reservoir, Laxapana falls and the Warleigh Church, built in 1878 perched overlooking the hauntingly beautiful Castlereagh Reservoir.

Madulsima

Surrounded by beautifully pruned tea estates, misty mountains, and a mini-World’s End in Elemana.

Moon Plains

The central plain located in Nuwara Eliya. It is a vast greenland complete with a surrounding forest reserve, tea estates, gardens and vegetable farmlands.

Pidurutalagala

The impressive Pidurutalaga 2,524m is Sri Lanka’s highest mountain. The peak offers views of the Nuwara Eliya town, and Lake Gregory and well as that of Adam’s Peak to the Southwest.

Raxagala

Raxagala is popular among hikers owing to the stories of lore associated with it. Raxagala is supposedly the place where Ravana, the king of Sri Lanka had hidden Sita for a while.

Thangamale Sanctuary

Part of the Glenarney Tea Estate, it is a 131-hectare sanctuary and is a two-kilometre drive from Haputale town.

World’s End

A sheer cliff, located in Horton Plains National Park in Nuwara Eliya, World’s End is a deadly drop shrouded by cold white mist.

Water falls

Bambarakanda and Diyaluma falls

The tallest waterfall in the island, the Bambarakanda falls pours continuously while the stunning Diyaluma falls takes the credit for being the third highest in the island. Picnic or enjoy a moment while engaging in a memorable time with family or friends.

Devon Falls

Located along the Talawakele–Hatton Road in the Nuwara Eliya district it is a vision of striking green and foaming water down the falls.

Parks and Botanical Gardens

Jaffna, Mannar and North

Beaches

Casuarina Beach
Twenty kilometres from Jaffna will take you to the idyllic Casuarina Beach in Karainagar – named after the fuzzy-pine-like casuarina trees lining the long stretch of shore.

Kankesanthurai (KKS)
Long strolls in the windy surroundings, boat rides and picnicking on the beach are the most popular activities here. The area, is fast becoming a hub for beach lovers.

Kudiramalai beach
Accessed via the Wilpattu National Park, it is a serene expanse of scrub forests, coastal cliffs with a red hue, and wind-swept driftwood. To get there, one must traverse the coppery-colored sands of Thambapanni.

Pigeon Island
This beautiful island is one of the two marine national parks in Sri Lanka, ideal for diving and snorkelling. The coral reef, which is about 200m long and 100m wide has over 100 species of coral and 300 species of reef fish.

Doric House
The resident of the first British Governor of Ceylon, Frederick North.

Fort Hammenheil
The octagonal shaped fort is located between Kayts and Karaitivu on the Jaffna Peninsula.

Grand Mosque
The Grand Mosque was built by Muslim traders during the Dutch era in 1973.
Jaffna.

Jaffna Fort
Built by the Portuguese, this fort is standing evidence of the colonial past of Sri Lanka. The 400 year old edifice, designed in the shape of a pentagon, is a symbol of Dutch architecture.

Jaffna Library
The colossal building that is a landmark in Jaffna is a center of knowledge and intellectual gathering.

Kandarodai Temple

Kudiramalai
The Aryan Prince Vijaya of North India landed on the shores of Thambapanni with 700 followers in 543 BC.

Manthiri Manai
An ancient Royal Palace that was built in the

100AD passed through the hands of a number of dignitaries from Jaffna’s ruling elite.

Pannai Bridge, Jaffna
One of the most ambient locations in the island to watch the sunset. The bridge connects the peninsula with the Kayts and Mandaitivu isles. Nearby is the Pannai Park where families, relax and joggers keep their fitness regime on the walking tracks.

Museum
Sivapoomi Museum
Opened in 2020, the museum features antique artefacts, newspaper displays and the museum yard has statues of Tamil kings, who ruled the Jaffna Kingdom and there is a collection of vintage cars, too.

Kitulgala

A famous hub for water based adventure programs including white-water rafting. Surrounding by spectacular scenery with forest-covered hills and kitul palm trees.

Knuckles Mountain range

The mountain range is a paradise for those who like to hike and mountain bike as it offers numerous mountain trails that cross spectacular scenery such as clear crystal rivers, dense forests, flowing waterfalls and lush plantations.

Nelum Wewa

The hot water springs found here are at a temperature of 62°C! The reason being that these hot water springs in fact connect to others in the island such as the hot water springs of Kanniya, Trincomalee and Maha Oya forming a network of springs through the earth’s crust and thus to maintain a healthy source of water at other regions the three additional wells were closed off at Nelum Wewa.

National Ironwood Forest (Jathika Namal Uyana)

Namal Uyana (Pink Quartz Mountain Range) abounds with natural beauty and its tranquility and stillness encourage visitors to search for spiritual fulfilment. Sri Lanka’s biggest concentration of ironwood trees are found here.

Pussellawa

Many interesting places to visit including tea plantations, Chariot Path, Peacock Hill, and Kotmale Valley. Also here is the Sri Kathirvelayutha Swami Kovil Murugan Temple, originally built in the 1880s.

Randenigala

The Victoria Randenigala Rantembe sanctuary is nestled between the Knuckles range and the Central mountains of Kandy.

Sembuwatta Lake

A beautiful man-made reservoir located in Elkaduwa, Matale. The lake is bordered by Cambell’s Land Forest reserve and situated at an elevation of 1,140m.

Wiltshire Mountain Range

A less explored mountain range in Matale, with wildflowers and Caribbean pines. Ideal for trekking.

Cultural Sites

Anuradhapura

A city of immense historical and religious significance, revered as the holiest and oldest Buddhist city in Sri Lanka.

Aukana

The massive Buddha statue that had been carved out of a single rock stands peacefully amidst the temple precincts in the sacred city of Anuradhapura.

Dambadeniya

Situated about 31 km from Kurunegala, it served as the capital of Sri Lanka in the mid 13th century. Much of Dambadeniya still lies buried on a huge fortified rock.

Gal Viharaya

For centuries the four Buddha statues of the Gal Viharaya have stood in deep contemplation. *Polonnaruwa*

Kala Wewa

Believed to have been constructed by King Datusena (459-477AD), the tank formed part of an ancient irrigation system that was used for agriculture,

helping to uplift the region. Elephants can be seen on the banks of this tank in the evening.

Nalanda Gedige

An ancient stone temple that was constructed during the eighth and tenth centuries with Dravidian architecture.

Polonnaruwa

A city renowned for its ancient ruins, Polonnaruwa’s kingdom once reigned supreme over the island for a relatively short period, from the 11th to the 13th Century. Its archaeological square is a great place to experience age-old artefacts; tombs, stupas, structural remains of temples and statues.

Pidurangala

A large and unusual rock formation that sits alongside the Sigiriya Rock Fortress, the two icons dominate the landscape. Pidurangala like Sigiriya, has historical ties to King Kashyapa and is an ancient monastery complex.

Sigiriya

The eighth wonder of the world, the rock fortress of Sigiriya ‘Lion Rock’ – is a 500 foot monolith, rising magnificently out of the dry central plain. The ascent begins at an entrance way through a large carving of a lion; the remnant of its stone paws clearly noticeable. The frescoes are a highlight of the massive complex built by King Kashyapa.

Yapahuwa Rock Fortress

Yapahuwa is famed for the rock fortress and the stone lion. Drive past the quaint town of Kurunegala, ringed by a giant boulder shaped like a kneeling elephant, and then emerge into a peaceful country where history sleeps.

Museum

National Museum of Kandy

Built like a noble Kandyan manor, one-storied but large with polished wood roofs, doors and stone floors, the museum is a treasure trove and a gallery of priceless art. +94 81 222 3867. *Opening hours: 9am–5pm.*

Sigiriya Museum

Religious Sites

Alu Vihara

Known to be the repository of Buddhist wisdom, Aluvihare has a legacy that dates back millennia, recorded in its many caves as intricate murals, inscriptions and artefacts. +94 662 222 533.

Anuradhapura

The city’s spiritual prominence is exemplified by the presence of the sacred Bodhi tree, grown from a sapling brought by Bhikkuni Sanghamiththa to Sri Lanka. This tree, believed to be the oldest living tree in the world, thrives at the Maha Megha Vana Royal Park, a site of great historical importance in Anuradhapura.

Abhayagiri Chaitya

Was built by King Walagamba and the premises has housed the sacred Tooth Relic during the Kingdom of Anuradhapura.

Bahirwakande Temple

A landmark with a massive pristine white Buddha statue. From its high vantage point, the gigantic Buddha statue surveys the whole town. *Anuradhapura*

Buduruwagala Raja Maha Viharaya
An ancient Buddhist temple with seven Buddha statues that date back to the 10th century. *Monaragala.*

Dambulla Cave Temple
Rangiri Dambullu Raja Maha Vihara, UNESCO heritage monastery is the country’s largest cave temple complex, dating from the first century BC. +94 662 283 605

Embekke Temple

Built in 1371 by King Wickrama Bahu III and is dedicated to god Kataragama.

Galmaduwa temple

The temple is believed to have been constructed by Meegastenne Maha Adikaram under the direction of the queen of King Kirti Sri Rajasingha [(1747-1782 A.D.) Rajapakse, 2016]. *Kandy*

Isurumuniya Raja Maha Viharaya

The temple was built by King Devanampiya Tissa in 250–210 BCfollowing the arrival of Arahath Mahinda. *Anuradhapura.*

Jaya Sri Maha Bodhi
Venerated by hundreds of devotees, and on the Poya day, thousands more make pilgrimage to offer Pooja to the sacred Bodhi.

Jethawanaramaya
Jethawanaramaya by King Mahasen is hailed as the largest stupa in the ancient world.

Kadadora Viharaya
The temple was abandoned and ruined as the construction of Kotmale Dam in 1979 by

Mahaweli Development program. The ruins of Vihara still can be seen when the water level of Kotmale Reservoir lowers.

Lankatilaka Viharaya
Built with three storeys in a ornate design with bright frescoes and a seated Buddha, the Lankatilaka Viharaya dates back to the 14th Century AD. +94 76 664 1154

Lankaramaya

Situated away from the Maha Megha Vana Royal Park where many religious sites can be seen. Built by King Walagamba, the Dagoba is said to enshrine precious jewels within.

Lovamahapaya

A structure that is said to have been of nine storeys, and was built by King Dutugemunu for the use of the Bhikkus who lived in the Maha Vihara.

Matale Sri

Muthumariamman Kovil
The temple is an exuberantly decorated structure that can be easily seen from afar. The prominent towers, called Gopurams, boast hundreds of detailed sculptures, in a rich mosaic of colour. *Matale.* +94 662 222 481. *Opening hours: 4.30am–8pm.*

Mihintale

Known as the cradle of Buddhism in Sri Lanka. King Devanampiyatissa met Arahath Mahinda Thero here on Poson Poya Day, in 246BC when the Dhamma was brought to the country.

Mirisawetiya

The first Chaitya built by King Dutugemunu, as an offering to the Sangha. It has been built on a site consecrated by the Buddha’s presence and therefore it is venerated by countless devotees that piously worship the Dagoba.

Mahamevna Uyana

Created by King Mutasiva, the naming of Mahamevna Uyana is steeped in legend. The Mahamevna Uyana has four heritage sites of importance – the Sacred Bodhi Tree, the Samadhi Buddha Statue, Ruwanweliseya and the Thuparama stupas. *Anuradhapura*

Ridee Viharaya

Consists of several shrines built into the hollows of caves, or erected out of stone and daub. *Kurunegala.*

Ruwanweli Maha Seya
Built by King Dutugemunu remains a site of great veneration, evoking spirituality in the hearts of visitors.

Somawathie Temple
Situated within the Somawathie Wild Life Reserve and the road reaches a clearing where the temple and its precincts can be found. At a glance a clear white bubble of stupas sits strikingly with no other elements to detract from its presence. *Polonnaruwa.*

Sri Dalada Maligawa
Also known as the Temple of the Sacred Tooth Relic, the Temple is a fine display of Sri Lankan artistry, and venerated by Buddhists across the world. Within are awe-inspiring carvings and Kandyan era paintings. +94 812 234 226. *Kandy*

St Anthony’s Church, Wahakotte

The church was completed in 1938, its Gothic revival style designed by the Italian monk Augustine, to replace a smaller church built in the 1920s. *Wahakotte.* +94 662 289 210.

Thanthirimala

The ancient Thanthirimala Temple is spread across, closely located rock surfaces surrounded by dense jungle. *Anuradhapura.*

Kalawewa National Park

Somawathie National Park

Udawatte Kele Sanctuary

An ideal beach town for sun and sea lovers and about an hour’s journey from Colombo, Negombo is also a short trip from the airport in Katunayake. With fabulous sunsets, strolls along the shore, little shops selling garments and souvenirs, live bands playing, restaurants peppering almost the entirety of the seaside strip, water sports at the beach park; fishing, kite surfing, snorkelling, scuba, are a part of the everyday sights, sounds and things to do, when in Negombo. The town is also home to historical sites, and also known as Little Rome for its churches.

Places to visit

Kalpitiya Fort
Built in 1666 was a key point in colonial times being involved in trading cinnamon.

Lellama

‘Lellama,’ is the famous fish market of Negombo. The hustle begins before the sun rises as the fishermen bring ashore their catch of the freshest fish, crabs, prawns, lobsters and cuttlefish.

Negombo Fort
Witness the imprints of the colonial era. To lay

claim to this trading point for spices, the Portuguese built the Negombo Fort.

Chilaw

80km north of Colombo, Chilaw is a relatively undiscovered coastal town with a great beach and many other attractions.

Puttalam

This stretch of land boasts of some of the most picturesque locations of the island and is very popular for fishing, dolphin-watching and coconut production.

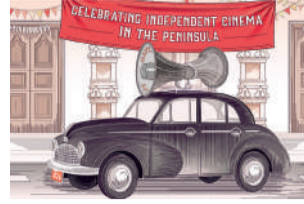
